“Touching Lives with Hope and Healing.” was the theme at Episcopal City Mission’s (ECM) 13th Annual Moment in Time Gala on October 13th. Held at a new venue, Greenbriar Hills Country Club in Kirkwood, the evening centered on how the ECM chaplains touch the lives of the children they serve in the Juvenile Justice System.

The highlight of the evening was our guest speaker, Isaiah Darris, an 18-year-old young man who told his story of how he came to be in the Juvenile Justice System. He shared what the chaplains meant to him in detention and at Lakeside and how they helped him through some difficult times while still showing him God’s love.

Isaiah is now on his own in the world – working full-time, planning to attend college in 2017, and aspiring to be a prosecuting attorney in the future. In addition, he has been a minister since his pre-teen years. ECM is very grateful to Isaiah for sharing his story and we wish him nothing but the best in the future. After the event, Isaiah sent the following note:

“It was an honor to be able to speak last night. Totally different than what I thought it would be. Great hospitality and I was shown much love.”

THANK YOU LAKESIDE RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT CENTER

St. Louis County Government has announced that Lakeside Residential Treatment Center will close at the end of this year.

Lakeside opened as Lakeside Center for Boys in 1962 with the goal of providing an open residential treatment center for youth referred by the St. Louis County Family Court that would allow them to remain close to their home communities and maintain regular contact with their parents during treatment. Over the years Lakeside expanded to include treatment services for girls, a community-based transitional living group home, emergency shelter care, and specialized treatment units for substance abuse and sex offenders. Over its 54 years of operation, Lakeside helped hundreds of youth learn to make responsible decisions, lead productive lives, and avoid progression into the adult criminal system.

ECM has provided chaplaincy services to Lakeside since 1989, providing hope, healing and a ministry of presence to these young people. ECM thanks and commends the Lakeside staff for their many years of service to the youth placed in their care. They will be missed.

ECM PURSUING NEW OPPORTUNITIES

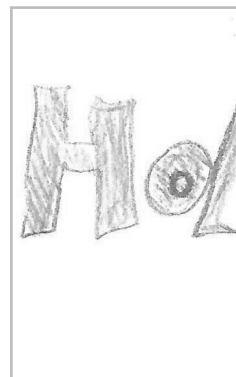
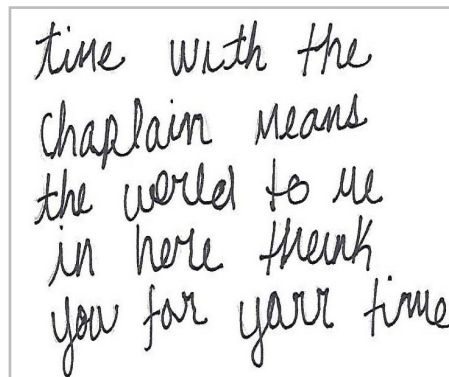
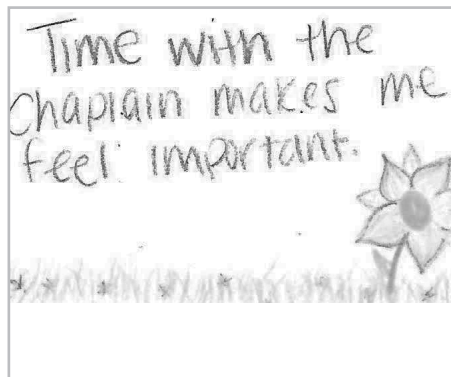
As the saying goes, when one door closes another door opens!

We are sad at the closing of Lakeside Residential Treatment Center. However, this situation allows us to pursue other sites where children in the Juvenile Justice System are being detained.

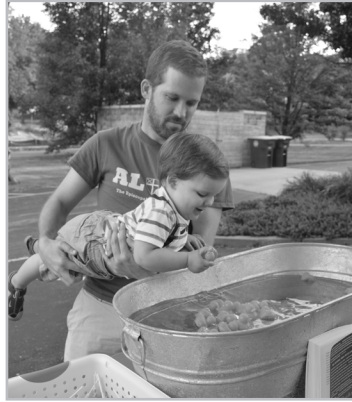
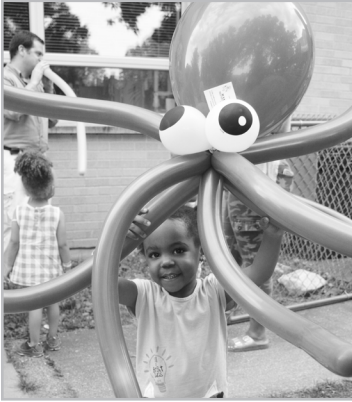

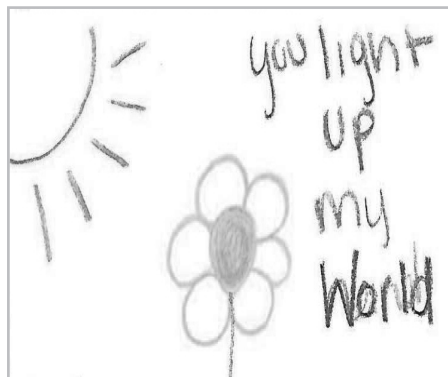
