Touching Lives with Hope and Healing

Episcopal City Mission (ECM) held its 14th annual Moment in Time (MIT) Gala on October 12th at Greenbriar Hills Country Club in Kirkwood, MO. Attendees were entertained by pianist, Roy Pennington, during the opening reception. Immediately following, guests enjoyed a delicious dinner topped off with tasty mini-desserts! The Rt. Rev. G. Wayne Smith spoke after dinner, providing inspirational words about the work of ECM's chaplains in the juvenile justice system.

Mr. Rick Gaines, our keynote speaker, began his presentation by talking about his work in St. Louis County's 21st Judicial Circuit, where he was appointed the Chief Juvenile Officer (CJO) in March of 2017. Prior to this appointment, Rick worked for 30 years in various positions in Missouri's 13th Judicial Circuit Court, which includes Boone and Callaway counties.

Rick spoke about the changes taking place nationwide in how juveniles are handled in today's Family Courts. In an effort to ensure that youth are not inappropriately or unnecessarily detained in secure detention, the St. Louis County Family Court is involved in a national and statewide project entitled the *Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative* (JDAI).

As part of JDAI, the Court is committed to working collaboratively with community members and stakeholders to improve long term outcomes for youth. More intentional focus is placed on detention admissions decisions, case processing procedures, the availability and utilization of alternatives to secure detention, conditions of confinement, and using graduated responses to address probation violations. These efforts assist in reducing racial, ethnic, and gender disparities within the system.

ECM is honored to be part of the JDAI Collaborative Team. Beth Goad, our executive director, is serving on the Conditions of Confinement Committee as a community stakeholder.

ECM SERVING MORE YOUTH IN NEW PLACES

ECM continues to explore ways to serve more children in the juvenile justice system. While still serving children in the St. Louis City and County Detention Centers, our chaplains are now serving youth in Missouri Hills, a Missouri Division of Youth Services facility, and adult-certified juveniles being held in the St. Louis City and County Justice Centers.

There are hundreds of children committed to Missouri DYS facilities. Many of the children in DYS already have relationships with ECM chaplains due to their time at the St. Louis City and County Detention Centers. Providing chaplains to the children in DYS facilities fits within our mission and we are currently providing two chaplains to work with one group of boys (Chaplain Kevin) and one group of girls (Chaplain Dietra) at Missouri Hills, a DYS facility that currently houses about 70 young men and women.

Already this year, ECM has provided hip hop concerts at the Detention Centers and Missouri Hills. The next concert will be held in December as part of our holiday celebration for the children we serve!
